Refund Information

In all cases of Students who withdraw, or who are suspended or expelled, the following refund policy shall apply:

The refund of tuition and others fees (excluding material fee) for students who have completed 60% or less of the period of attendance shall receive a pro rata refund. Returned kits may be subject to a reconditioning fee of up to 50% based on their returned condition. If the Student obtains a loan to pay for an educational program, the student will have the responsibility to repay the full amount of the loan plus interest, less the amount of any refund. Credits or Refunds shall be paid within 45 days of cancellation or withdrawal.

If the Student obtains a loan to pay for an educational program, the student will have the responsibility to repay the full amount of the loan plus interest, less the amount of any refund.
